b. Home Based Learning (HBL) Day and Student-Initiated Learning (SIL)


To further enhance the schooling experience and develop our students into self-directed learners, all students would be engaged in both face-to-face lessons and home-based learning (HBL). As such, **all students would be having HBL day on 4 March, 11 March, 25 March, 8 April and 22 April (Fridays)**. Subjects allocated for these days would follow individual class time-tables which would be shared by the Form Teachers 1 week prior to the start of each HBL day. The time-table and general topics/tasks that students would be engaged in would be uploaded on our school website under '**Academic Matters**'.

Other than the subject-based HBL during the abovementioned Fridays, Student-initiated Learning (SIL) will also be an added feature. Students are allocated 1 hour during HBL days to pursue their own interests and learn outside of the curriculum. For SIL, your child/ward will be showing you his/her plan. You are encouraged to have a discussion with your child/ward on the plan to further cultivate his/her passion. Thereafter, your consent is required for your child/ward to proceed with the SIL activities. The school appreciates your support and guidance for your child/ward.

We hope that with the upcoming term break, Woodgrovers will make good use of their time to read widely, immerse themselves in current affairs, explore their interests and do some revision to strengthen their foundation where necessary.
